The mission of the Minnesota River Valley National Scenic Byway Alliance (MRVSBA) is to cooperatively enhance the Minnesota River Valley as a travel destination and raise awareness of its nationally important stories to provide economic benefits and preserve the intrinsic qualities of the byway. Kristi Fernholz, the MRVSBA Coordinator, worked hard this year leading several core byway projects. We're lucky to have her guidance and expertise. Together with other Alliance members, the MRVSBA had a very busy and productive 2018.

MRVSBA completed an updated Corridor Management Plan and Marketing Plan. These plans are listed on the website at www.mnrivervalley.com. The new Visitor Guide was completed and will be available through 2019. Thank you to the advertisers who make this publication possible.

MRVSBA promoted the Byway through our Facebook page (@mnrivervalley), including paid advertising of our tourism videos, targeting adventure travel and the Twin Cities markets, among other demographics.

In 2017, with a Heritage Partnership grant through Minnesota Historical and Cultural Grants Program, MRVSBA worked with Dakota experts to develop Dakota along the Byway. In 2018, we added this Dakota content to our website and completed other website updates.
