

#### **Dakota Language**

One of the first and oldest languages in this region (or State) is known as Dakota lapi. Place names are included on this map to honor the Dakota community and the names used and borrowed to understand the Minnesota we know today.

The Dakota have ancient and sacred relations with the Minnesota River Valley and adjacent landscape. Stories identify Mni Śota (Minnesota) as homeland, a place of creation to which Dakota have always been connected.

#### △ Historic Dakota Village Sites

Historic Dakota Villages The Mni Śota River Valley is Dakota homeland. This map illustrates some mid-1800s village locations, but Dakota people and their ancestors have lived throughout the river valley for millenia. These historic sites acknowledge this strong cultural context and remind all Minnesota River Valley visitors and residents of its history.
